Faculty

Jeannie Hill is the second flute of the Northwest Sinfonietta and a member of the WindSong Classical Trio. The co-founder and director of the NWFC, she is a much sought-after teacher, adjudicator, and performer. Ms. Hill is a graduate of Pacific Lutheran University and a private flute instructor for over thirty years.

Jacqueline Hofto recently moved to Tacoma, WA from Austin, TX, where she taught at the University of Texas and performed with the Austin Symphony. For many years Ms. Hofto was principal flutist and soloist with the Northwood Orchestra. She was formerly on the faculty of the University of North Texas and Visiting Professor at Rice University, Interlochen Arts Academy, and CIM Preparatory School.

Kate Mondragon holds a BM in Flute Performance from CSULB and a MM in Flute Performance from UNLV and has been teaching privately flute lessons for over ten years. Mrs. Mondragon is principal flute of the Federal Way Symphony, a member of the U.P.S. Community Music Department, adjudicates solo and ensemble contests in the Puget Sound Region, and has been a guest clinician in the Auburn, Puyallup, and Tumwater School Districts.

Darrin Thaves is the Principal Flute of the Northwest Sinfonietta and Instructor of Flute at CSULB. The cofounder and director of the Northwest Flute Collegium and Pacific Flute Ensemble, he is also the competition coordinator for CSULB Annual Flute Competitions. Mr. Thaves was the winner of the 2000 Seattle LMC Young Artist Competition and many NFA Competitions.

Wendy Wilhelmi is active as a teacher and performer throughout the Pacific Northwest, frequently playing with the Seattle Symphony, Seattle Opera, Northwest Sinfonietta and Pacific Northwest Ballet Orchestra. For two seasons, Wendy served as assistant principal flute and piccolo of the Vancouver (BC) Symphony and prior to that was a regular member of the Spokane Symphony. In 1998, Ms. Wilhelmi won first place in the NFA Piccolo Artist Competition.
